#### The Carillon Tower

The Carillon Tower is a war memorial and museum rolled into one, with a really unusual bell tower that houses 47 different bells. They can be played to ring out melodies rather than peels.

You can visit the ground floor for free, but there is a very small cost for visiting other floors and the tower climb.

The Tower and museum are open between Good Friday to 30<sup>th</sup> September, everyday but Monday's 1pm - 4.30pm. However, if you wish to visit outside these times you will need to contact the museum.

#### Charnwood Museum

## You Scream, I Scream, We all Scream for Ice Cream

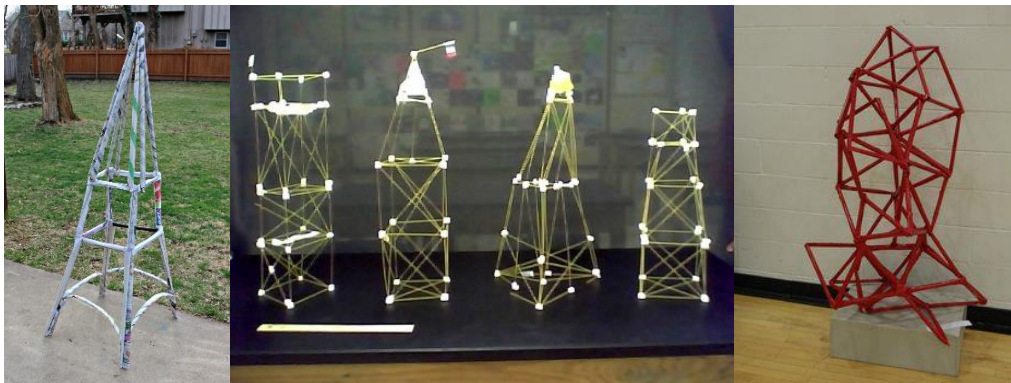
